Road markings

In the spring, the City will refresh road markings throughout the municipality: active corridors, edge and center lines, stop lines, and crosswalks will be repainted to improve safety and visibility.

In addition, the City will gradually replace old street name signs during the 2026 season in order to standardize and modernize municipal signage.

Bulky item collection by registration

Due to popular demand, bulky item collection by appointment is back.



Spring cleaning

In the coming weeks, mechanical sweepers will begin cleaning sidewalks, active corridors, and main arteries, then continue with secondary streets.

These sweepers will cover approximately 111 km of streets, 18 km of sidewalks, 12 km of active corridors, and 7 municipal parking lots, at a maximum speed of 20 km/h. It is therefore normal for cleaning to take several weeks.

To facilitate the work of the crews and ensure optimal cleaning, we are counting on your cooperation. Please park your vehicle in your driveway during the day and store your hockey goals, basketball hoops, and recycling bins on your property after use.

Road maintenance operations will continue throughout the summer.

- Total: 670 votes

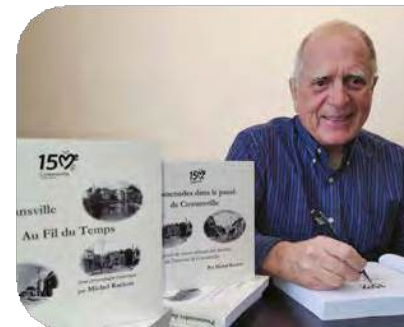
